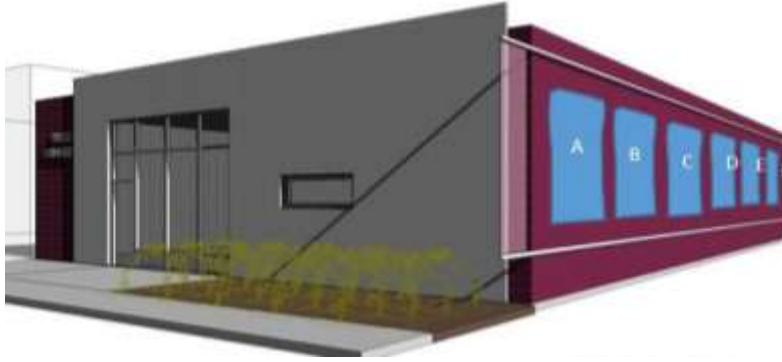


Visual Artist Call For Submissions:



“The Paint Spot Six”

Budget: Artist Fee and Paint \$1500 (per 8'x8' Mural)

Deadline for Submissions: March 20, 2016

Installation: July through August 2016

We're seeking six different artists to create paintings on panels to be installed on the east exterior wall of The Paint Spot, 10032 81 Avenue. Each piece is 2 panels put together to make an 8 foot x 8 foot painting. The six pieces, professionally installed, will make the dark purple wall of The Paint Spot look like an outdoor art gallery.

The back alley behind The Paint Spot between 100 and 101 Streets is transitioning into an alley of street art and murals. The Paint Spot's wall faces the Trinity Church Mural and the Tirecraft Street Art Mural. Together, these three buildings create a mural courtyard around a parking lot.

Panels will be provided and prepared, varnished and installed by The Paint Spot. Paint can be purchased for this project from The Paint Spot at a 40% discount. Staff can offer advice on permanency and paint yield. Studio space for working on these large paintings may be available at The Paint Spot (by appointment).

Mural experience is an asset but not mandatory.

To be considered for this mural, the proposal should fit into one of the following categories:

- A. Figure
- B. Landscape
- C. Abstract
- D. Floral
- E. Urban Sketch
- F. Graffiti

Please include the following in your submission:

- A rendering of the proposed art work
- Artist contact information (address, phone number, e-mail address)
- Artist CV
- Artist Statement
- 3 images may be sent via email. Please do not email images higher than 500 MB.
- A link to a website of related images may also be accepted.
